3. HeadTeacher's Report	<p>Head Teacher's Report to Parent Council - February 2016</p> <p>Staffing</p> <p>We were delighted to welcome Craig McDonald from Oban High School to our Maths department. Craig joined us on Monday 22nd February.</p> <p>We are interviewing to make our temporary English post permanent and long leet interviews take place next Tuesday.</p> <p>The Curriculum Leader Social Subjects post closes on Friday and we look forward to a lot of interest in this post.</p> <p>Attainment & Achievement</p> <p>Having completed prelims and about to receive their reports, our Senior Phase students are very much focusing on achieving their potential. As well as Mentoring for selected students we have also revamped our website on Supported Study. This is being followed up with input to PSE from the Senior Team in school.</p> <p>We held a well-attended S2 Parents' Information evening as well as Parents' Evening and have our new Senior Phase Parents' Evening next Monday.</p> <p>We were delighted that one of our students was highly commended for the Creative Writing prize and received £50 of book vouchers.</p> <p>On Thursday 4th February Tynecastle students involved in Debate Mate took part in the first round of the Urban Debate League</p>	

held at Leith Academy. This involved all of the Edinburgh Debate Mate schools competing against each other to gain some valuable experience and to start accumulating points for the national Debate Mate scoreboard.

Tynecastle entered three teams and also had three supporters who helped teams prepare. Each team took part in two debates and the motions ('This House would allow school pupils to vote on what you learn in school' and 'This House would ban the advertising of things that are bad for your health') certainly generated some heated discussion!

All three Tynecastle teams performed fantastically and won five out of six debates. Feedback from the judges was very encouraging and we look forward to the next round of debates on Thursday 3rd March being held here at Tynecastle High School.

This year's Holocaust Memorial Day, 27th January 2016, was on the theme of 'Don't Stand By'. As a school we have marked the occasion in a series of special assemblies led by Miss Howie. Lucie Meechan and Elliot Buist were chosen earlier in the year to take part in the 'Lessons From Auschwitz' programme. The students created a video using images from their trip and discussed the impact the experience had on them and the importance of the theme 'Don't Stand By'. Their video is being shown to students and is available to watch on the school website.

Poetry By Heart - Congratulations to James Gibson who came second in this competition, building on his success from Burns Night perhaps.

We are delighted that a number of our S5 and S6 English students are today taking part in the second National Theatre workshop on [The James Plays](#) - three plays about James I, II and III of Scotland by Rona Munro and directed by Laurie Sansom.

The James Debate Project uses themes from the plays to discuss and explore various issues and help students build their debating skills. Students will be debating the motion " *We learn from history that we do not learn from history*" and three students will be lucky enough to see all three James plays and take part in a further workshop in February.

Our Sporting Achievements Awards will take place on Thursday 10th March and promises to be an entertaining evening with celebrities lined up to perform.

8. AOB	<p>The recent emergency evacuation of the school following a hoax call was discussed. It was suggested that a brief note explaining the morning's events could have been prepared to be sent home with each student that evening. Hazel advised that the school was commended for the way in which the situation was handled. Hazel also explained that because the whole school was evacuated, text messaging to parents was organised and carried out by the Council from Waverley Court.
