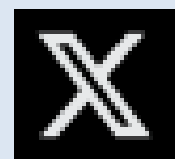

PAUSE, THINK, GROW PROGRAMME - LINKLIVING

We are delighted to announce a new programme from Link Academy called Pause, Think, Grow, which will be launching in October 2026.



Pause, Think, Grow is an early intervention programme for young people aged 11–13 who are experiencing difficulties with behaviour, emotional regulation, or relationships, and who may be at risk of exclusion, disengagement, or involvement in offending behaviour. The programme runs in small groups two days a week at the Goodtrees Neighbourhood Centre, with additional one-to-one support and peer-led sessions delivered by trained volunteers.

The programme helps young people build confidence, develop tools to manage their emotions, and strengthen relationships at home and at school, while supporting them to make more positive choices for their future. During the programme, young people will take part in group sessions where they can develop practical emotional regulation and decision-making skills, explore how behaviour can affect themselves, their families and their communities, and build positive connections locally. They will also have the opportunity to join peer-led workshops with people who have lived experience of the justice system and access one-to-one support when needed.

ADVANCE – ENABLE, FORTH SECTOR AND THE ACTION GROUP

Advance is a partnership between Enable, Forth Sector, and The Action Group, focusing on supporting people who are already in employment.

When a serviceperson leaves the Armed Forces, it is a big change, affecting the whole family. This is where Ruby Boots comes in. The project is co-produced by young people themselves, aiming to deliver peer support to children and young people whose parent/carer is leaving the Armed Forces. We run peer support groups across Edinburgh and Fife, encouraging a sense of community, positive wellbeing, as well as having fun activities and maybe even some Capri-suns! We train up Buddies as volunteers (Veterans' children) to use their first-hand experience to help their peers (children whose parent is soon leaving/just left). The groups run for 6 sessions, with opportunity to extend and/or participate in other events and projects with Forces Children Scotland.

RUTS are a provider of vocational and employability support designed to equip young people with the confidence and skills required to achieve their highest potential and reach a positive destination.

Mentoring:

LINKnet provide one-to-one mentoring for education, employment and personal development. There is a drop-in service every day from 10 am - 4 pm that provides short-term support on employability and education (e.g., CV building, job application, interview, etc.). Booking for a session in advance is recommended to avoid disappointment.



Volunteering:

Job seekers who do not have UK work experience will be invited to volunteer with LINKnet or with partner organisations to get work experience. They will be requested to work 2 – 3 days per week.

English Classes:

Group English classes are offered at beginner-to-intermediate and intermediate-to-advanced levels. Classes focus on improving practical language skills for employability, further education, and life in the UK. From December there will be online teaching.

Befriending:

Befriending programme is offered for people who need language, social, and emotional support, for example, English learners and newcomers to UK who would like to further develop English skills, make connections in the community, and/or feel less isolated and lonely.

THE JOURNEY PROGRAMME – VENTURE SCOTLAND



Venture Scotland offer young people aged 16-30 a group-based personal development programme set in the outdoors. It is completely free and is focused on helping to improve young people's physical, mental and emotional wellbeing. The programme is group-based (up to 12 participants per group) and involve meeting twice a week to participate in fun and challenging sessions that use the outdoor environment to stimulate and sustain personal development and growth. Activities include everything from hill walking to canoeing to coasteering and loads more in between.

Qualifications gained:	Scottish Canoe Association <i>Paddle Start</i> Award
Client group:	Anyone living in Edinburgh aged 16-30 who is struggling and would like the support to make positive changes to their wellbeing.
What is provided:	Joining us is absolutely free to young people. This means that during the programme we provide every young person with full outdoor gear, meals, and we can also cover transportation costs if needed.
Start date:	We recruit on a rolling basis, so do not have set start dates. However, we start programmes seasonally and will take referrals for our waiting list at any time.
Duration:	Up to 6 months long. Our programme runs for 12 weeks and then we offer 'Next Steps' support for participants when they have engaged with the programme and are wanting a bit more support with figuring out what to do next.
Times and days:	Usually Mondays and Tuesdays with residential running over multiple days throughout the week (programme dates will be communicated to participants in advance of joining the programme).
